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

BOXING DAY CHARITY RUN – SAT 26 DECEMBER 2015 – KILDERMORIE

A good, fairly dry but cold day saw a large variety of vehicles assemble at Skiach Services. Eventually 27 were heading north to Ardross, turning left off the Skiach-Struie road, we travelled approximately 5 miles on a well surfaced single track before passing through the entry gates in Strath Rusdale to Kildermorie Estate.

A further 4 ½ miles saw us go round Kildermorie Lodge with a further 5 miles up to the Bothy in Gleann Mhuire. Unfortunately, this was the end of the track today as we had been told to go no further due to a washout and a deteriorating track further up the hill. This was where we had experienced and enjoyed a climb on snow and ice on previous outings!

With very little parking at the Bothy and no room to pass on the narrow track, I directed the vehicles, one at a time, on to the grass at the west end of the Bothy where they then reversed back on to the track beyond the Bothy and continued to reverse further along in order to accommodate all the vehicles. Unfortunately by restricting the turning area to one part we chewed up the ground to the side of the Bothy. This will dry out with windy and drier weather.

Due to the exposed situation and the widespread vehicles, it was not ideal for socialising/lunch. We therefore proceeded back in the direction that we had come returning round the Lodge and proceeding to the designated play area west from the top end of Loch Morie. I should state here that, unfortunately, only about half of us did!

Andrew and I at the drivers' meeting had omitted to mention "The Convoy Rule". This more or less requested that each vehicle was responsible for keeping a safe distance from the vehicle in front and also for keeping an eye on the one behind, so that in the event of a breakdown or similar incident we should all pull up and remain together. We had mentioned this previously on Corrieyairack and Coignafearn runs but had had no incidents on these days!

On this occasion, a driver who had just joined the club, ended up in a trackside ditch (not so difficult to do if attention wanders on a narrow track!). The driver in front, possibly not aware of the incident or of the 'rule', carried on – the front runners being unaware of any problem!

After what turned out to be a difficult recovery, the remaining vehicles arrived at the play area. After finishing the turkey sandwiches, most vehicles had a play for an hour or more in the water filled holes. These varied in depth from deep to very deep with many vehicles making spectacular splashes and bow waves when entering and crossing some of the larger ones! An impressive sight! After a while, with most ready to leave, it was a case of rounding up the few stragglers still playing and, led by Neil, making our exit from Kildermorie Estate. A good day having been had by all!

Many thanks to Mr and Mrs Duncan for granting us admission to their spectacular Estate. £405 was donated to The Highland Hospice, being

Mr and Mrs Duncan's chosen charity, with the balance aiding club funds.

Thanks must also go to Charlie Munro for arranging the Run with the estate.

Good turn out as usual for the first trial of the year. First section catching some out on the boulders. Second section-quite straight forward Section three-uphill through trees and roots was very slippy Section 4 caught 3 drivers out at 3^{rd} gate which was up a wee hill with no run up for speed and the last gate was a side slope where if you went too fast you got the points! Section 5 – Slow through gates 1,2 and 3 then power up the hill to the left for a big loop gates 7 and 8 very slippy

Section 6- back down the road for the first gate, over the road to second and third gates which were tight. Fourth gate was impossible due to side slope and slippy – reverse required once through for gate 5 then uphill for 6,7 and 8.

Section \mathcal{F} – This was at the bottom of the gully. This turned ou to be quite good even though the open guys were there first. Gate 2 was steep up hill thrash. Well done to Craig Shaw who was first up and made it look easy. Only Neil Taylor was towed out – The <u>ONLY</u> tow of the day!

Section 8- Back up to the top of the site and far right. Had to make easy section up to gate 7, gate 8 at the top of a well rutted hill climb - only a few got through but it was a good effort as it was getting dark by this time.
