Recent COMMITTEE MEETING, August

At the most recent Committee Meeting, the following points arose:

- 1 The committee intends to bring in a new rule that, in order to win a trophy or an award in the annual club championship, a competitor must ACT AS AN OFFICIAL at an event during that year. This includes acting as Clerk of the Course, or as Scrutineer. It is intended to incorporate this new rule, as from the beginning of 2019. This is in order to encourage more club members to take part in running trials and other events,
- 2 Peter MacInnes is the committee member now responsible for equipment. In particular, he has undertaken to ensure that the canes, fire extinguishers, etc, will be gathered after a trial, and relayed to the CoC of the next trial. Therefore:
 - If Peter is in attendance at a trial or event: Please return all equipment to Peter after the event.
 - If Peter is NOT in attendance at a trial or event: CoC should gather all the equipment, and contact Peter after the event to arrange a suitable time and place to meet and hand over the equipment.

In either of the above cases, Peter will then make arrangements to ensure that the equipment is passed to the CoC of the next event.

3 Counting up points won at competitive events to ascertain the winners of each class in the club annual championship is carried out by referring to the scores and attendance records SHOWN IN THE NEWSLETTERS OVER THE YEAR.

Therefore, it is very important the CoCs should PLEASE ensure that:

- At the very least, a list of attendees (for EVERY event) is sent to the newsletter editor.
- If the event was a trial, then, obviously, the scores must also be sent, too, please.
- 4 Scores towards the annual championships are awarded for attendance at noncompetitive events. So, if you attend a hill run, you are awarded 6 points, in the class you normally attend, toward the championship in that class. Again, CoCs are asked to ensure that lists of those attending, even at non-competitive events, are sent to the newsletter editor.

For your information, scoring at competitive events towards annual championship is as follows:

1st place: 12 points. 2nd place: 11 points. Etc.



SAFETY SPOT THIS MONTH: THE REVERSE HOOK LAW

When towing another vehicle out of the mud look out for what Chris Smith has



christened the "Reverse Hook Law": i.e. if the other chap's tow hook fails – it's you who gets it in the face. A strong safety strap should be wrapped tightly around the tow rope about three feet from the tow point, or fastened on with a shackle, and attached to the vehicle's bumper. If the tow point separates, the safety strap should stop the stretched rope from firing the tow hook straight at you.

RULE OF THE MONTH

According to the SPECIFICATIONS section at the back of the Rule Book:

VEHICLES MUST HAVE SECURE TOW POINTS FRONT AND

REAR.

These should be fastened or bracketed to the chassis, not just to the bumper.

4X4 TRIAL Supplementary Regulations

- 1. The H4WDC will promote a cross country Vehicle Trial on **Sunday 26 August**. The event will be held entirely on private land at **Laggan**.
- 2. The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of the RACMSA LTD (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Codes of the FISA), these regulations and any written instructions the Club may issue for the event.
- 3. MSA permit has been granted. PERMIT No: 108610.
- 4. The event is open to all fully paid up members of the H4WDC.
- 5. Competitors must produce a valid club membership card and sign on. Club membership number must be displayed on participating vehicles.
- 6. The program of the meeting will be as follows:
- (a) Scrutineering starts at 09:15 hrs
- (b) Competitors not signed on by 09:45 hrs may be excluded from the event.
- (c) First vehicle starts at 10:00 hrs
- 7. Vehicles will fall into classes as per club rules i.e. SWB, LWB and OPEN. Vehicles may enter into one class only. The starting order on sections will be as per Club Rules. Competitors on the day of competition may be split up into 2 groups.
- 8. All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical Regulations.

Passengers may only be carried in accordance with Rule H. 11.3.2.

- 9. The entry fee is £15 per competitor. All entries must be made on the official entry form and accompanied by the appropriate fee. All officials must also sign-on on the official signing on sheet.
- 10. The secretary for this meeting is: **Elaine Smith**.
- 11. The maximum entry for this meeting, inc reserves is 40 and the minimum is ten. Should the minimum figure not be reached, the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting.
- 12. Other officials are:

Clerk of the course: NEIL TAYLOR

Scrutineers and Club Marshals: Non-competing / attending Committee Members

- 13. Results will be available after the competitor completes each section by simply asking the scoring marshal. Results of the event will be published in our monthly newsletter.
- 14. Any protests must be lodged in accordance with 0.5.1.



Neil Taylor is running this one and he says:


Expect the usual and the unusual for this event !!!!



How to get there:

Follow the A9 south past Aviemore and Kingussie, pass the Nuide trial site, pass the snowgates and Ralia. Take the next small road on the right signposted for Glen Truim and a caravan park, carry on up this wee road for approx. 3 miles and the trial site is on the right. Grid ref NN660 935, postcode PH20 1BT will get you close.

How to get there:

Leave Inverness on the B862. Pass Scaniport, after 2.5 miles turn left at a staggered cross roads. If you reach the old school or Dores you've gone too far. Follow the road up the hill, after just over a mile a track crosses the road, turn right into the track and it'll take you in to the site. Grid ref NH 613 355
